**Services:** Our agency offers both direct counseling services to clients, as well as, psychoeducational presentations in a group environment. Our services are focused on individual, couple, family, and child/ adolescent services with a variety of issues. Many of our clients are referred by the courts or through our victims' assistance services. Direct experience is available in the following programs.

**Counseling** CFS offers general counseling services to individuals, couples, and family based on a sliding-fee-scale. CFS also works with insurance providers including Value Options. ***\*Bilingual (Spanish) services provided***

**First Offender**

Provides a five-week, multi-family educational program offered to youth who are in trouble with the law for the first time. Offenses are a class B misdemeanor or lower. Typical offenses include, but are not limited to: curfew violations, runaway, and theft). This program focuses on teen challenges, experiences, and family communication.

The program requires the attendance of the youth and a least one parent / guardian for all five sessions. Upon completion of the program, the offense will be adjudicated from the youth's record. CFS's goal is to reduce juvenile delinquency and crime through strengthening family systems. Please visit our calendar for class information.

**Threat Assessments**

CFS offers threat assessments for both youth and adults referred by school personnel or employers. All assessments are completed within 48-hours for a fee of \$25

**Victims' Assistance**

The Victims' Assistance Program is designed to provide assistance to victims of crime and their families. Services provided are FREE of charge.

**Services:**

- Counseling (Play Therapy, Individual, Family and Group)
- Crisis intervention
- Criminal Justice Support (case status & information)
- Court Accompaniment
- Assistance in filing Crime Victims' Compensation
- Assistance in filing Emergency and Permanent Protective Orders
- Information and referrals to local financial assistance
- Information and referrals to local legal assistance

**Minor in Possession (MIP)** This six-hours Minor in Possession Education Program is a State certified psychoeducational program for adolescents cited by law enforcement officials for being in possession of alcohol. Successful completion of the program will satisfy court requirements for adjudication. This program is also available to families who are concerned about underage drinking. Participant must register for the class online (\$5 processing fee will apply) or in person at our office between the hours of 8:30AM and 5:00PM Monday - Friday. Please allow 20 min. for your registration. Any minor 16 years and under must have a parent / legal guardian present at the time of registration. Please visit our calendar for class information.

**Tobacco Awareness (TAP)** The eight-hour Tobacco Awareness Program is a State certified psychoeducational program for adolescents cited by law enforcement for being in possession of tobacco. Successful completion of the program satisfies court requirements for adjudication. This program is also available for families who are concerned about teen tobacco use. Participants must register for the class online (\$5 processing fee will apply) or in person at our office between the hours of 8:30AM and 5:00PM Monday - Friday. Any minor 16 years and under must have a parent / legal guardian present at the time of registration. Please visit our calendar for class information.

**Tackling Teen Truancy** The Tackling Teen Truancy Program is a four-hours psychoeducational program for adolescents who truant. The Tackling Teen Truancy Program is one of the ways that we as a community can reach out quickly to a disaffected young person and help families that maybe struggling with their somewhat rebellious youngster. **Theoretical Orientation:** CFS strongly believes in tailoring the treatment to meet the needs of the individual. Interns / Practicum students will be exposed to many different modalities of therapy including, but not limited to:

- Cognitive Behavioral Therapy
- Solution-Focused Therapy
- Narrative Therapy
- Collaborative Therapy
- Person-Centered Therapy
- Gestalt techniques

- Existential Therapy
- Family Therapies

Most importantly, CFS believes that the relationship built between a therapist and the client is the most important aspect of counseling.

**Supervision / Evaluation:** All interns / practicum students will receive weekly group / individual supervision by a license professional. Students will also receive a mid-term and final evaluation completed by both the Clinical Director and Clinical Supervisor.

**Time Commitment:** Each student is required to be available to our facility a minimum of **TEN** hours per week for two semesters (at minimum).

We require both copies of the student's professional liability insurance (or proof of enrollment in practicum or internship), class schedule, and a criminal background check (completed by the agency upon acceptance to the clinical program).
